The UCLA Integrated Substance Abuse Programs (ISAP) invites applications for Pre and Postdoctoral Research Fellowships sponsored by the National Institute on Drug Abuse. UCLA ISAP is a part of the Semel Institute for Neuroscience that includes nationally recognized substance abuse scholars in epidemiology, public health, psychology, sociology, neuroscience, pharmacology, program evaluation and social policy. The Integrated Substance Abuse Programs offer a wide array of research, publication and funding opportunities in virtually all aspects of substance abuse research with a strong emphasis on health services research.

Eligible candidates must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident and must have an M.D., Ph.D. or a current graduate student working toward his/her dissertation in public health, psychology, anthropology, sociology, social welfare or nursing. The two-year Fellowship can be extended an additional year for Fellows demonstrating research excellence. Stipend levels are commensurate with National Institutes of Health Research Service Awards. Each Fellow will also receive health benefits (post-docs only), and tuition (pre-docs only) in addition to allowances for travel and supplies for research projects.

To apply, send a letter of interest, curriculum vitae and three letters of reference. Graduate students, in addition to the above, send a copy of your transcripts.
